

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on March 23, 2021, the United States District Court for the Northern District of West Virginia in the above-captioned matter entered the following Order [Dkt. No. 44]:

Parliam in the adove-captioned matter effected the following Otder [DK. 180, 44]:

Before the Court is Plaintiff Dominion Energy Transmission, Inc. ("DETI") now known as Eastern Gas

Transmission and Storage, Inc.'s ("EGTS") Motion Regarding Payment of Just Compensation and Release of Excess Cash

Deposit pursuant to Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 65(c) and 67 and 28 U.S.C. §§ 2041, 2042. On September 30, 2019, the Court granted DETI's motion for summary judgment and motion for preliminary injunction granting immediate possession of the easements identified, requiring that DETI deposit a certified check in an amount of \$5,000.00 for the easements sought for the above-captioned case. Dkt. No. 21. On October 8, 2019, DETI deposited with the Clerk a certified check in the requisite amount. Dkt. No. 22. On September 22, 2020, the Court granted DETI's Motion for Summary Judgment ordering that DETI remit to the Clerk of the Court the amount of \$83.00, plus pre- and post judgment interest, to be paid defendants in compensation for the easements conveyed to DETI through this condemnation process

Based on the cash deposit already in the registry of the Clerk in this matter, the Court FINDS that security is no longer necessary "to pay the costs and damages sustained by any party found to have been wrongfully enjoined or restrained." Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(c). Furthermore, the Court FINDS that, as of March 31, 2021, the amount of \$85.15 would be the amount of just compensation plus pre- and post judgment interest owed to the remaining defendants.

Accordingly, for good cause shown, the Court GRANTS the Plaintiff's Motion Regarding Payment of Just

Compensation and Release of Excess Cash Deposit. Furthermore, the Court ORDERS that the amount of \$85.15 remain in the registry of the Court as payment of just compensation, plus pre- and post judgment interest in this matter.
