**NOTICE OF PUBLIC COMMENT HEARINGS
AND CORRECTION OF NOTICE OF FILING**

On January 30, 2026, NextEra Energy Transmission MidAtlantic, Inc. (NEET MA) filed with the Public Service Commission of West Virginia (Commission) an application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity pursuant to W. Va. Code § 24-2-11a (Application) to construct and operate the West Virginia portions of the MidAtlantic Resiliency Link Project (MARL Project), a new proposed approximately 107.5-mile, 500 kV transmission line that will traverse portions of Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Maryland, and Virginia, including a new 500/138 kV Woodside Substation to be located in Frederick County, Virginia, and other associated transmission facilities. The West Virginia portions of the MARL Project consist of approximately 58.9 miles of 500 kV transmission line and related facilities in Monongalia, Preston, Mineral, and Hampshire Counties (the West Virginia Portions). The Commission has designated the Application as Case No. 26-0075-E-CN.

The MARL Project includes components other than the West Virginia Portions. However, only the West Virginia Portions are subject to Commission approval in this case. The current cost estimate for the MARL Project is \$1.167 billion. Of this estimated amount, the current cost estimate for the West Virginia Portions is \$482,706,000. These estimates include siting, engineering, construction, financing, administration, and legal costs. NEET MA estimates that the Project will have an impact on customers of Monongahela Power Company and The Potomac Edison Company.

A copy of the Application and its attachments, including large-format versions of the maps of the proposed route, may be examined in the offices of the Executive

Secretary of the Commission, located at 201 Brooks Street, in Charleston, West Virginia; the offices of the Clerks of the County Commissions of Monongalia, Preston, Mineral, and Hampshire Counties; the Arnettville Public Library, Cheat Area Public Library, Clay Battelle Public Library, Clinton District Public Library, Morgantown Public Library, Kingwood Public Library, Terra Alta Public Library, Burlington Public Library, Fort Ashby Public Library, Keyser-Mineral County Public Library, Piedmont Public Library, Capon Bridge Public Library, and Hampshire County Public Library; and on the Commission's website, www.psc.state.wv.us, under Case No. 26-0075-E-CN. Included in each of these copies of the Application are large-scale maps showing the proposed route in greater detail. The Applicant's website is available at the link below:

One of our roles at Hampshire Gas is to maintain the natural gas wells and pipelines throughout Hampshire County. However, events such as storms and floods may cause pipeline damage. In addition, fires burning on or near pipelines present an unsafe situation. While we remain ever watchful, we are asking for your help. Knowing the signs of escaping natural gas or potential hazards can help protect all of us.

If you hear hissing, blowing or roaring sounds coming from the ground, or if you see blowing sand, dirt or water; unexplained fire, dead vegetation or ground discoloration; or exposed pipelines, please call Hampshire Gas immediately at 1-304-822-5664 (M-F, 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.) or use our 24-hour emergency numbers, 1-800-221-0221 (toll free) or 1-703-750-4371 (collect).

Also, keep in mind that it is possible for gas to seep into buildings, including those without natural gas service. If you suspect the presence of natural gas, please evacuate the building immediately, leaving doors unlocked as you go. Do nothing that could create a spark — do not light a match, use any type of phone equipment. Turn on electrical equipment or light switches on or off, or start your car. Call 911 once you have reached a safe distance away from the building.

Call WV811 (Miss Utility) before you dig or excavate.
Damaging an underground utility line may cause serious injuries, costly repairs and service outages for you and your neighbors. To help prevent damages, everyone — including homeowners and construction companies — should call WV811 (Miss Utility) at 811 or 1-800-245-4848 at least 3 business days BEFORE you start to dig. This free service will contact the companies or utilities involved and they will locate and mark all the buried utility lines on your property using high-visibility safety paint and/or flags, so you will know where all electric, phone, cable television, natural gas and sewer and water lines are buried. Always call Miss Utility before you dig, each dig, and every dig.
